# A Little Bit of History..... **A Confusing Church**

If you have ever been inside All Saints' Church, Little Kimble you will know that it is a beautiful little jewel of a church, but if you try to read up about it you may become confused by the contradictory statements made about it. The church is dated at 1300 by Sir Nicholas Pevsner and that is backed up by the fact that the first priest dates from then. However, there is a Norman barrel font dated 1100 and a document referring to a church in 1245, but no priest.

The two halves of the church are built in different styles and are different sizes so if you look down the church it looks like two half churches joined together. The church is from 1300, and there was a church in 1245, but not the present one.

There used to be a castle sited in Little Kimble with a double motte with a keep on one motte and a church on the other. There was no priest recorded because the Chaplain of Lady de Bolbeck acted as priest.

In 1300 the new church was begun in the Early English style but a terrible famine struck in 1314 and the village of Little Kimble was abandoned and church building ceased with it half finished. Later in the century church building resumed but in a different style [Decorated]. The only part of the old de Bolbeck church is the font. The famous wall paintings were added in 1370.

If you visit the Church you may find the leaflet guides missing as a gentleman who violently disagrees with my account periodically removes them and sometimes substitutes his own which may be recognised by the eccentric spellings. Sometimes church history can be controversial.
