## The Little Bit of History

**Early railways in Kimble** At the beginning of Queen Victoria's reign there was a spate of railway building and the first main line out of London linked London and Birmingham from Euston [sound familiar?] There was a branch to Aylesbury but it was very much a branch line and "Grandpa" Havnes of Little Kimble used to travel by foot to Tring Station to collect newspapers off the newspaper train so that people in Kimble got their newspapers before those in Aylesbury. He must have been remarkably fit. In 1863 the railway arrived in Little Kimble from another direction as local railways were built from Maidenhead to Wycombe, then from Wycombe to Risborough, and finally from Risborough to Aylesbury [The present station] These railways were all built by small local companies allied to the Great Western Railway so were built on a broad gauge of seven feet. **Unfortunately Parliament** passed the "Gauge Act" insisting on standard gauge. The GWR had to buy up the small companies and pay for their track to be reduced to standard gauge [4feet 8 and a half inches] As an experiment the first track to be converted entirely was the line from Risborough to Aylesbury. The work was completed in a weekend, by working from both ends, meeting in Kimble and you can see how much wider the track bed is than the present track. New rail replaced the old "Barlow Rail" but the old rail did not go to waste as it was used in fencing and gateways and you can still see some of it where the footpath crosses the track just south of the station.
