#### The Little Bit of History..... The Arabella Park, **Great Kimble** site of Cala Homes

Following from last

month..... After 1500 the site was a field within a series of fields which were enclosed as the large field, which originally exceeded a hundred acres and stretched down Grove Lane as far as Grove Farm, was divided up and sold. Many people will have learned in school that in the Middle Ages there tended to be large open fields worked communally and that enclosure acts in the Eighteenth Century led to their division. In fact, by 1650 we know that most of the parish of Great Kimble

was enclosed, and the 1805 Enclosure Act simply shared out the common grazing areas as the rest of the parish was already enclosed.

In the Enclosure Act farmer Rose owned the site. Later several smaller fields were combined which is why there are footpaths across the field. The land then was purchased by the Robarts family and more recently was presented as part of the Parish Neighbourhood Plan.

People often ask why the site is frequently described as being in Little Kimble, when it is clearly in Great Kimble. This goes back to the discovery by the developers, who built some of the houses in Grove Lane, that there were "council houses" in Great Kimble. So they insisted that their development was in fact in Little Kimble even though the nearest part of Little Kimble parish was by the Free Church. In fact the Post Office at the time used a rule of thumb whereby

areas of the parish connected to the Stoke Mandeville telephone exchange [now 01296 numbers] were described as Little Kimble and areas connected to the Risborough Exchange [ now 01844 numbers] were described as Great Kimble
